

- 3. Read the book *Dismantling Racism: The Continuing Challenge to White America* by Joe Barndt, one of the founders of Crossroads Ministries, an interfaith organization specializing in anti-racism training for religious and non-profit groups.

#### Action Suggestions

- 1. Educate yourself about the history of Iraq and U.S. involvement in the war and occupation. Some websites are www.vcnv.org or www.afsc. org/iraq. Then hold a teach-in at your church, school, or community center.
- 2. Attend the public speeches of political candidates or public figures who have supported or remained silent about the crimes of sanctions and war in Iraq. Ask questions.
- 3. Contact your elected representatives to ensure that no permanent ("enduring") U.S. military bases are constructed or troops left stationed in Iraq. Urge that the U.S. pay reparations for

suffering caused.

4. Call local media outlets to encourage accurate and comprehensive coverage of the war and its effects on the Iraqi people and U.S. soldiers.
5. Pray and act daily for peace.


